The Directorate has the overall responsibility for supervising kindergarten, education and the governance of the education sector, as well as the implementation of Acts of Parliament and regulations.

The Directorate is responsible for all national statistics concerning kindergarten, primary and secondary education. On the basis of these statistics it initiates, develops and monitors research and development.

The objective of the Directorate is to ensure that all children, pupils and apprentices receive the high quality education they are entitled to.

# Assessment and recognition of foreign vocational education and training

The Norwegian Directorate for Higher Education and Skills assesses the scope, level and vocational content of foreign vocational education and training in comparison to a Norwegian trade or journeyman's certificate.

# Norwegian vocational education and training (VET)

VET is part of the formal upper secondary education system in Norway. From the school year 2020–21, upper secondary VET in Norway covers 10 education programmes that lead to more than 180 different trade or journeyman's certificates.

# <u>Curriculum for Primary, Lower Secondary and Upper Secondary</u> Education

The Curriculum for Primary, Lower Secondary and Upper Secondary Education comprises two parts: the Core Curriculum and subject curricula for each subject. New subject curricula were in place from August 2020.

#### **Framework Plan for Kindergartens**

Framework Plan for the content and tasks of kindergartens entered into force on 1 August 2017.

#### Framework Plan for SFO

This framework plan applies to the work in out-of-school-hours care (SFO). SFO must facilitate play, cultural and leisure activities based on the age, functional level and interests of the children, and provide the children with care and supervision.

#### Framework for Basic Skills

This Framework is a tool for subject curricula groups appointed by the Norwegian Directorate for Education and Training to develop and revise National Subject Curricula.
